## **YEAR 7 SUBJECT SUMMARIES**

Art	This term, Year 7 students have been exploring the themes of tone and identity. They have developed their understanding of tone by practising techniques to show different levels of light and dark, creating depth and realism in their work. Students have also been learning how artists express identity through art. They studied the famous Mexican artist Frida Kahlo, exploring how she used symbolism and self-portraiture to represent her emotions and personal story. To celebrate Black History Month, students were introduced to local artist Kelvin Akoar, examining how his work reflects culture, heritage, and community.  As the term continues, students will build on these ideas and techniques to create a final self-portrait that reflects their own identity and individuality. Computing	Year 7 students have been exploring the impact of technology on society, learning how digital solutions influence the way we live and work. English	We welcomed Year 7 to Walthamstow Academy this year by encouraging them to find their voice. All classes began by exploring what it feels like to join the school through the medium of creative writing. This involved an in-depth study of narrative structure and the use of language for specific effects.

After creative writing, we moved on to study one of England's greatest writers, William Shakespeare. We are currently exploring the big ideas presented in *The Tempest* and will soon be learning how to analyse Shakespearean language in greater depth.

Alongside classwork, students complete 30 minutes of Sparx Reader as homework. This is designed to expose them to a wide range of texts and boost their literacy levels. We encourage you to monitor and support your child with these tasks whenever possible.

Each Friday, we also have a dedicated grammar lesson, which has already yielded promising results in student writing. This half-term, we are starting to diagram sentences as a way to improve fluency.

All classes have excelled with their homework, challenging each other to achieve the highest SRP scores. They are keen to share ideas and support one another wonderfully in their learning. As we move forward with our Shakespeare unit, we will focus on effective annotation and analysis, particularly developing extended analytical writing skills.

Each skill will be assessed during our assessment windows.

To support their learning, students complete 20 minutes of Language Nut homework each week, which helps consolidate what they've learned in class. We encourage you to check in and support your child with these tasks whenever possible.
